Audits undertaken and subsequent actions	Infection Prevention & Control audits were undertaken for Kintbury & Woolton Hill in December 2021 with support of Jintana Loss IPC Lead for West Berkshire. Clinical waste audit Hand Hygiene National Cleaning Standards audits were undertaken in September & December 21. Action plans include: Introduce laminated daily cleaning checklists Quarterly observations for hand hygiene audits Adjustments for reintroducing spirometry Requirement for new compliant taps Adjustments for covid surge – hot rooms, screening, appointments, flow
Risk assessments undertaken for prevention and control of infection	Risk assessments are undertaken to minimise the risk of infection and to ensure the safety of patients and staff. Training received by staff	 7 new staff joined the practice in the past 12-months and received infection control and hand-washing training within 3 months of employment. 80% of the Practice Clinical staff completed their annual infection prevention & control update training (e-learning) 84% of the Practice non-clinical staff completed their annual infection prevention & control update training.
	The Infection Control Lead attends regular IC Lead meetings.
	All staff have undertaken infection control and handwash training. There is a requirement for all staff to update this training annually. New clinical staff undertake a competency assessment for aseptic technique.
	New staff also undertake occupational health screening and are offered necessary vaccinations in house. OH screening is undertaken by Everwell online
Review and update of policies, procedures and guidance	All policies under the umbrella of the Infection Prevention & Control are reviewed in line with national and local guidance and updated 2 yearly (or sooner in the event of new guidance): Infection Control Decontamination Clinical Waste Cleaning Plan & Schedule Aseptic technique Specimen Handling Innoculation Injuries and Safe Use of Sharps Vaccine Storage and Cold Chain Break Temperature Recording Procedures
Infection Control Advice to Patients:	 Patients are encouraged to use the alcohol hand gel/sanitiser dispensers that are available throughout the Surgeries. Covid screening questions are asked at appointment booking and at reception desk. Face masks for the majority of this period have been compulsory in the premises and posters advise this. We continue to encourage mask wearing in patients and staff The team are able to provide leaflets or links by SMS to information about: Norovirus Chickenpox & shingles Influenza – during vaccination season Childhood immunisations Travel immunisations Recognising symptoms of TB Meningitis/septicaemia Measles HPV vaccination Whooping cough in pregnancy Posters have been minimised and leaflets in the waiting room moved away from communal areas during covid.
